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	<p>participation in the programme.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The programme was a finalist in the Examiner smart communities awards. • Young people decided to continue the programme once this funding was expended and began to look for other funding sources to continue their initiative. • When grade 8 students were invited to apply to join the team for 2008 more than half the grade applied. • Young people have continued the initiative in 2008 having already conducted a “Party Safe” lunch time café and a Tobacco Free movie night on Youth Tobacco Free Day. • Written feedback received from forum participants was very positive.

<p>How did the target community get involved?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 24 young people from 3 schools across the region attended the “Party Safe” camp at the beginning of 2007. • At the camp young people planned their upcoming party’s, forums and designed their own marketing material. • 200+ young people attended the “Party Safe” party in Dorset. • All secondary students from Flinders Island District High School and Cape Barron District High School attended the “Party Safe” mystery bus tour on Flinders Island. • 60 parents, community members, service providers and business owners attended the forums held in Dorset. • 30 parents, community members, services providers and business owners attended the forum held on Flinders Island. • Young people presented drama, led discussion and directed all aspects of the community forums. • Young people distributed their marketing material. • Young people presented their programme at the Statewide Resilience Conference in Hobart. • Young people have continued to be involved applying for grants and continuing to run events and activities that promote their message.

They have strong support from a senior staff member. As the youth health officer at the Dorset Council I continue to support the programme. Other community groups such as FEWCHA, the Dorset Youth Advisory Group have already chosen to support the team financially and local groups such as Rotary and Lions are considering funding the programme. The “Party Safe” initiative has a high profile within the community and the group will continue to look for innovative and creative ways to get their message across.</p>
